

# **BAND SPECS & TECNICAL REQUIREMENTS**



PDX Latin Rock Exchange brings all our own gear, PA, some lights and a few stage effects to every gig. So you need not worry about anything except where we play and that it has plenty of electrical outlets. We will need a covered (or indoor) stage area 8 feet deep and 16 feet wide as a minimum to fit 6 musicians and a lot of drums. For the full 10-piece big band, we will need a minimum stage width of 20 feet.



# **RATES & REQUIREMENTS**



Jazz trio: \$1000 Standard 6-piece party band: \$2000 Full ten-piece big band: \$3000 Each additional special request song to learn: \$500

We will need 2 changing rooms, access to a bathroom nearby, and a space (green room) to wait while we are not playing. We also need water and nourishment between sets.
